



But in the case of it appearing on his bulletin board, a member found it on another bulletin board and uploaded it on his system. The final versions of computer software usually carry a copyright notice. In his opinion, there is definitely questionable leak at Atari. He does not keep records of who logged on and off his bulletin board, he saw the game there, and feels like he did his part by taking it off the board. A sloppy procedure at Atari is what caused the confusion on this game.


